## Research Paper Help

The purpose of this assignment is twofold. First, it should help you understand Rome's over seas' policies. Rome's expansion from 396 BCE through the Third Punic War is covered in this paper. By the end of this assignment, you should understand how Rome treated those they conquered, and those they were fighting against. What about the Romans policies allowed them to be so successful?

The second purpose of this assignment is to understand how to formulate a good research paper. When writing an analytical paper, it is important that the author make clear the point he/she is trying to make. This point, which we will call a *thesis* should be something debatable. The purpose of the paper will then be to PROVE this *thesis*. It is important that throughout the course of a paper, this point is proved. Each paragraph should generally help support the overall thesis (the argument/point the author is making), and each paragraph should be supported by the details within.

For this assignment, you will be answering a number of questions about the CONTENT of the paper, as well as analyzing how successful the author of the paper is in arguing his point.

All of the content questions will come in order. – They are the questions that appear in Italics

You will have an entire class period to work on this assignment. If you do not finish, it will be due at the beginning of class on Monday. We will have a similar worksheet in the spring that should help you plan your research paper!!
